The New Zealand Certificate in Floristry (Level 2) Will provide you with the skills and knowledge to gain a qualification that recognises your skills and provides entry into a training and career pathway in the floristry industry.

This qualification will prepare you for a career as a beginner florist in floristry retail outlets. With further work experience and study, graduates may gain employment as Intermediate Florists in floristry retail outlets.

When you complete this qualification you will be able to:

- Prepare simple floristry items to meet customer specifications, and maintain quality of items to maximise their impact
- Carry out routine storage, care, and display of floristry stock and merchandise
- Communicate with floristry team members and customers to ensure the provision of appropriate customer service
- Maintain personal safety in a floristry workroom environment

English language requirements

Domestic students for whom English or Māori is not their first language must also have an IELTS (Academic or General) score of 5.0 with no band score lower than 5.0, or equivalent.

Entry requirements

If you are studying this programme you are only able to enrol in one course at a time.

Practicum

You need to be able to complete the 40 hour practicum for FLO203 Introduction to Retail Floristry. You also need to have access to a floristry workplace for FLO203 Introduction to Retail Floristry. The workplace must be approved by the Open Polytechnic and have an NZPF endorsed verifier.

Literacy assessment

When you enrol in this qualification you need to complete the Adult Literacy and Numeracy Assessment. This is a requirement from the Tertiary Education Commission for all Level 1 to 2 qualifications. You will need to do it when you start your studies, and again during your study time.

There is no pass or fail for the assessment. When you finish you can see a visual report with your results. Your tutor will use your results from the first assessment to find out what support you may need.

How you will do the assessment

After you fill in your online enrolment application we will email you a link to this assessment.

If you do not have access to a computer:
You can take this test in a public library, or a paper-based test may be administered under special conditions.

We will email you your second assessment before the end of your study time.
