Entry requirements

To gain entry into this programme you will need to be involved in training.

You also need access to a minimum of six adult learners, that you are teaching or training specific knowledge and/or skills. You can be teaching or training in the workplace, in a classroom, by distance learning, or in a community based organisation.

You need to confirm you can meet these on-the-job requirements as part of the enrolment process.

If you are studying this programme you are only able to enrol in one course at a time.

What you will learn

When you achieve this qualification you will be able to:

- design embedded literacy and numeracy strategies to enhance learner outcomes in a vocational or workplace programme with consideration of New Zealand's unique context
- embed literacy and numeracy teaching and learning in a vocational or workplace programme with consideration of New Zealand's unique context
- use assessment and evaluation as tools to enhance student learning and own practice in embedded literacy and numeracy teaching.

Computer and online access

To complete this programme you will need access to a laptop or desktop computer, reliable broadband internet connection and a data plan able to support online learning such as streaming of videos (including YouTube), downloading content, and writing and submitting online assessments.
